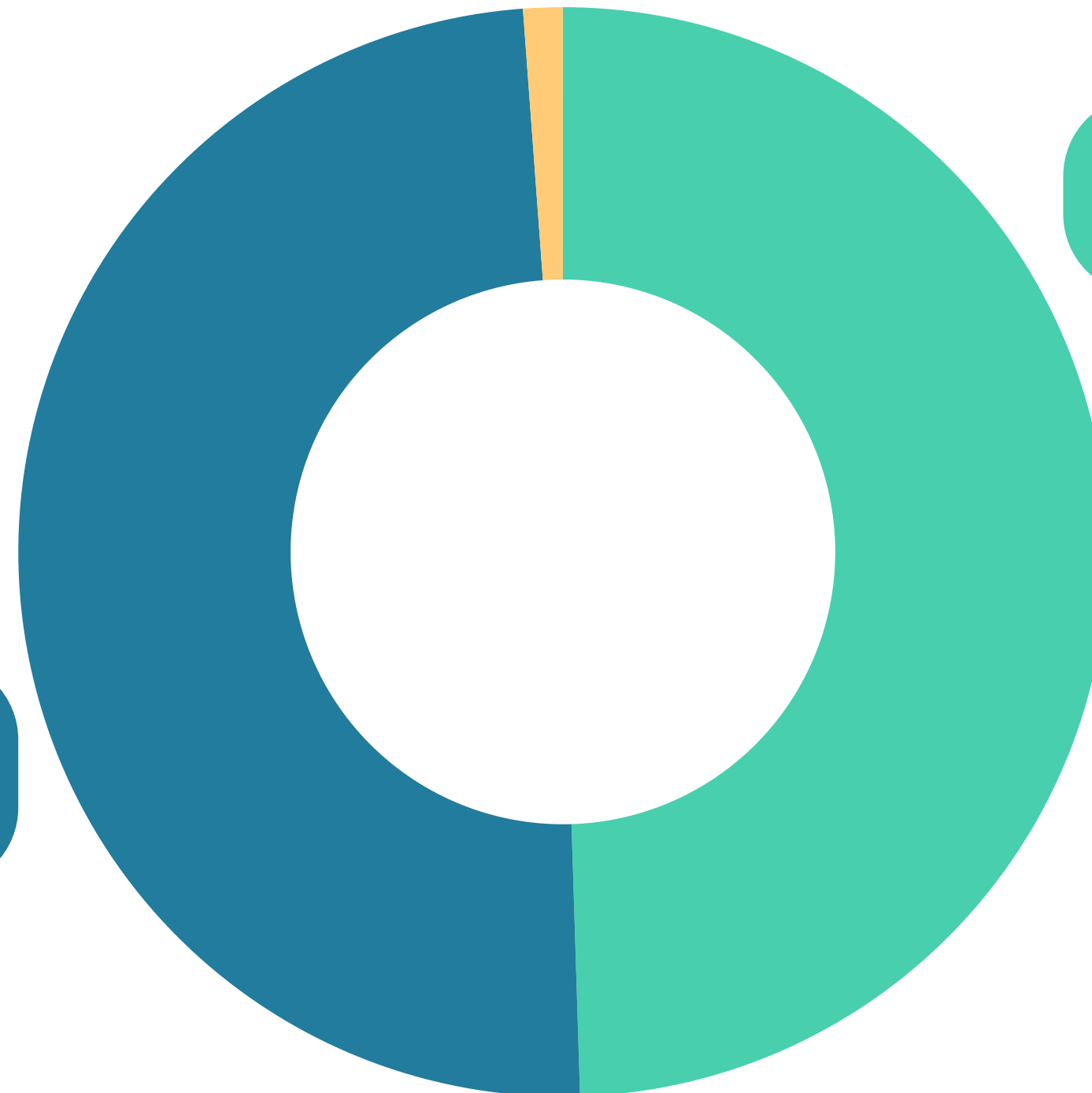

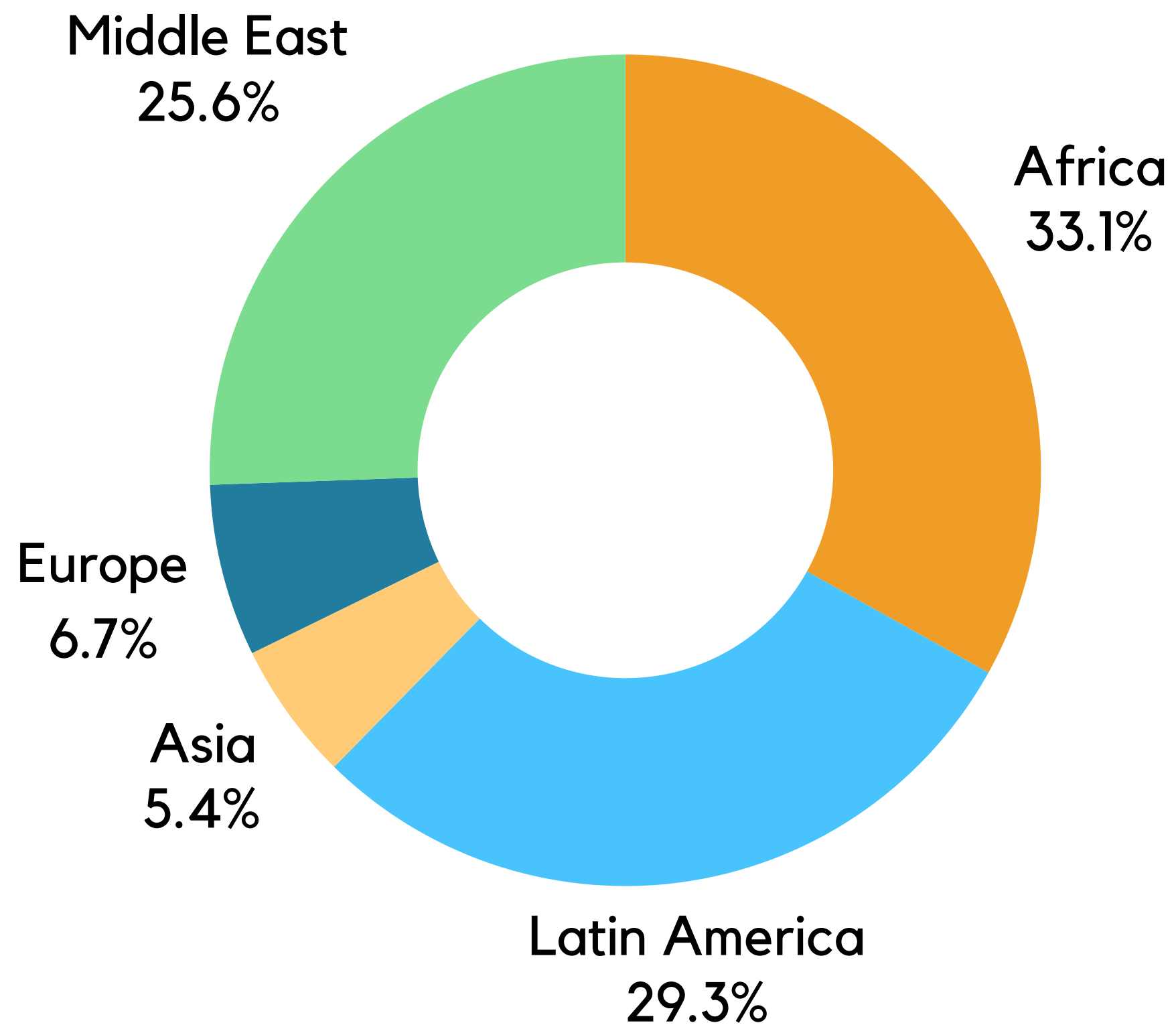

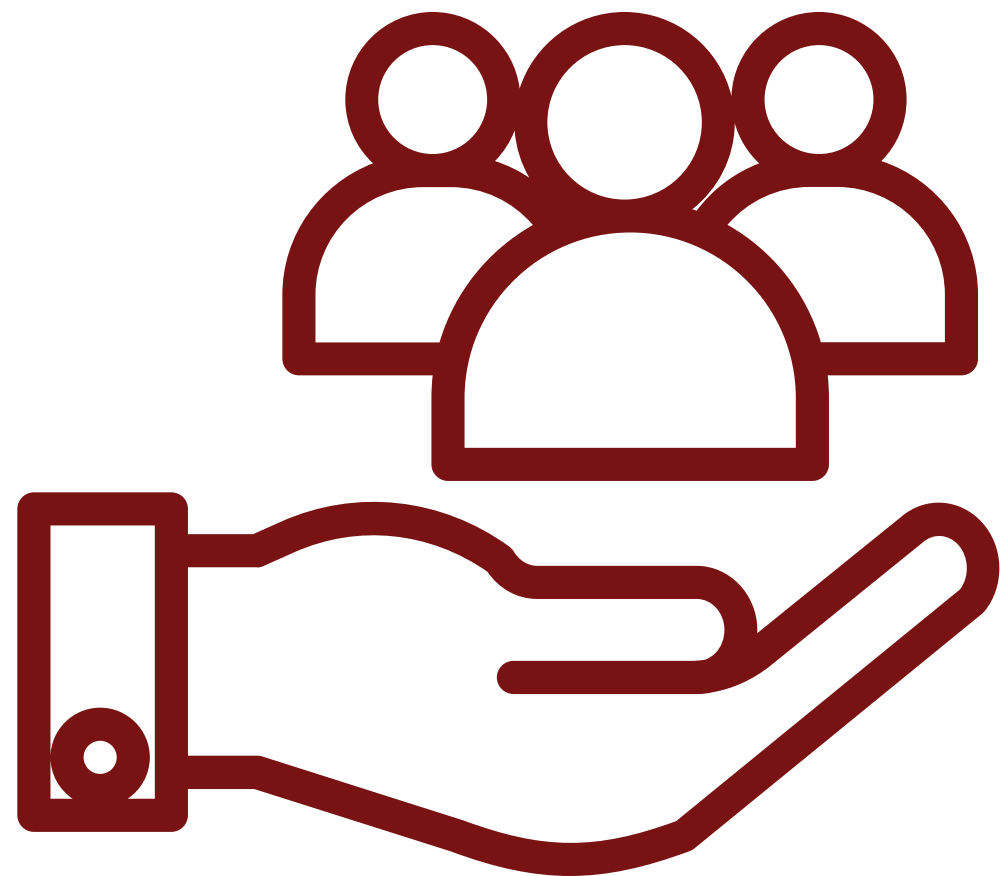
FUNDS ALLOCATED BY GEOGRAPHICAL AREA

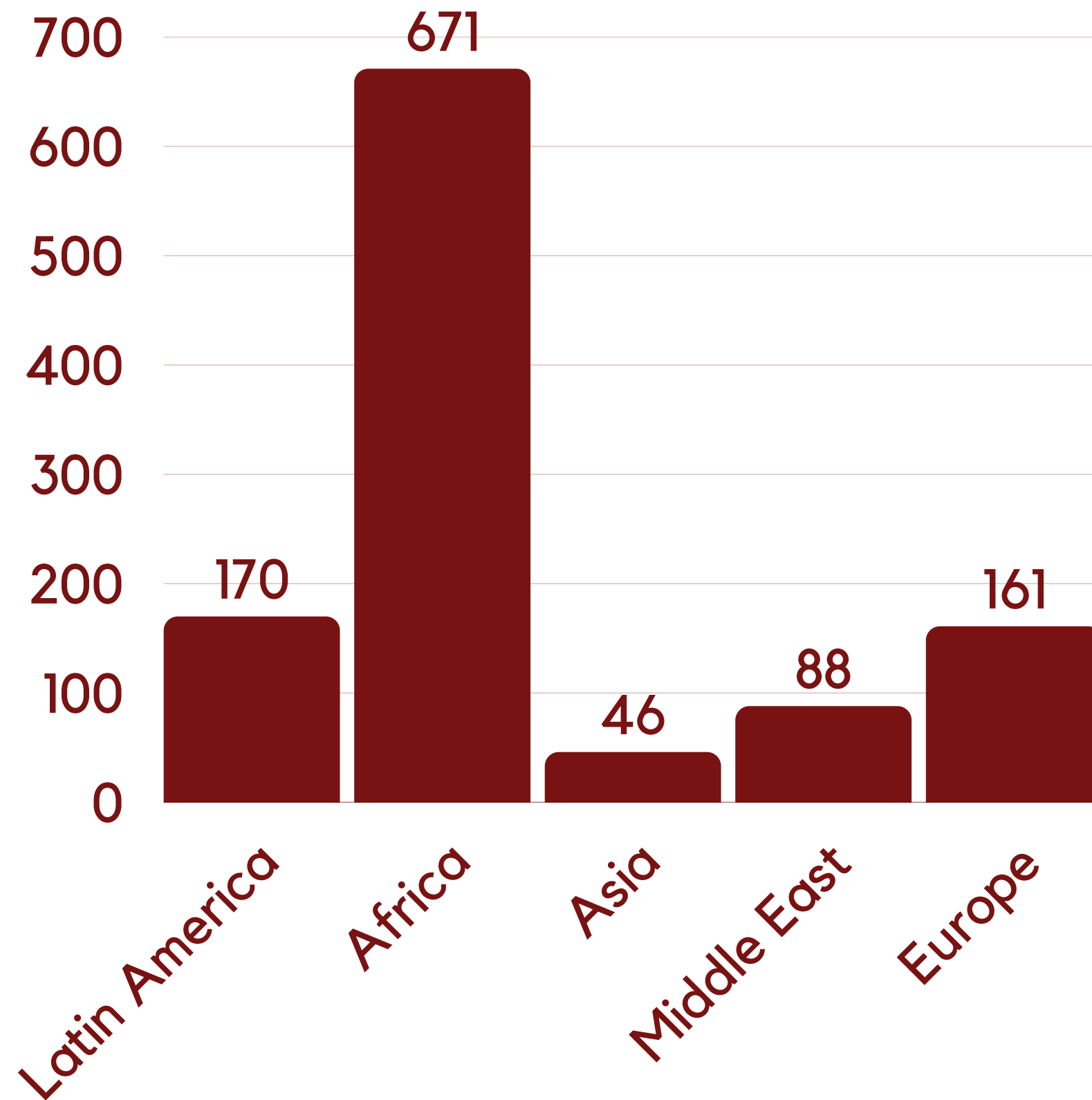

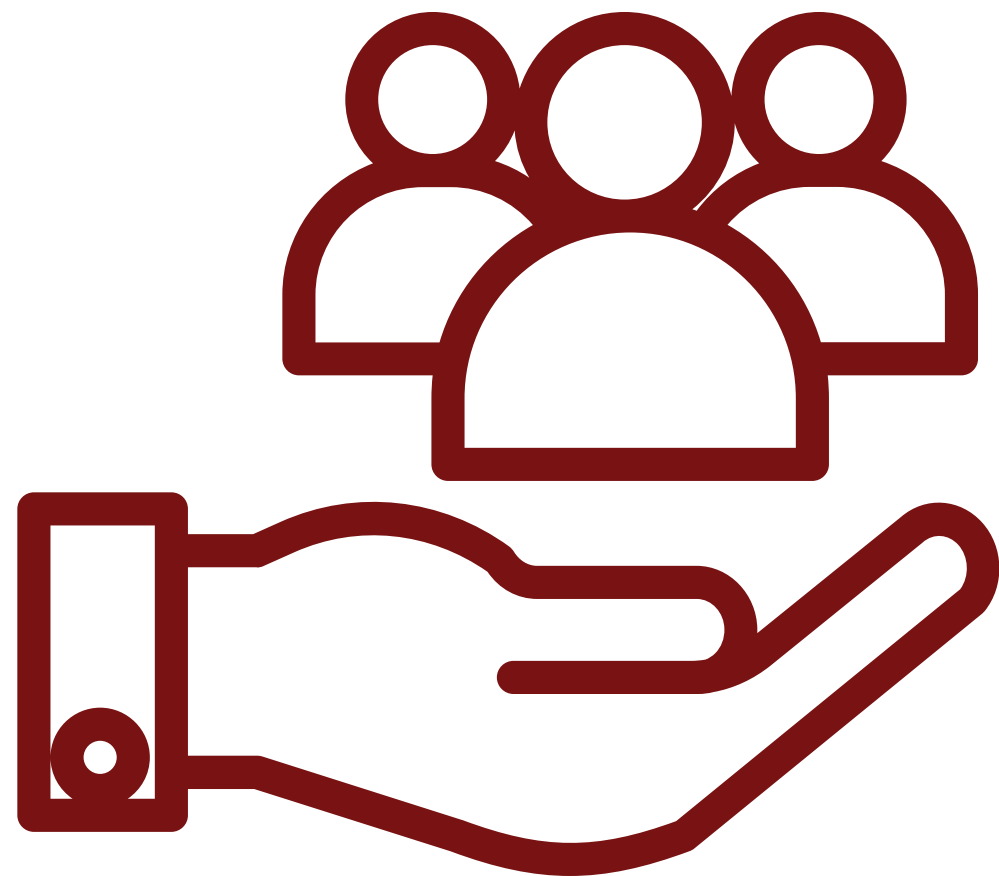

*In the province of Esmeraldas, a path of professional **training for young people and safeguard of natural resources** is being carried out; so as to promote eco-sustainable job opportunities and entrepreneurship and combat the ecological damage that is increasing the social vulnerability of these populations.*

- **Feasibility** study and selection of micro-entrepreneurial projects

- **Technical and psychosocial support** to the protagonists of the projects

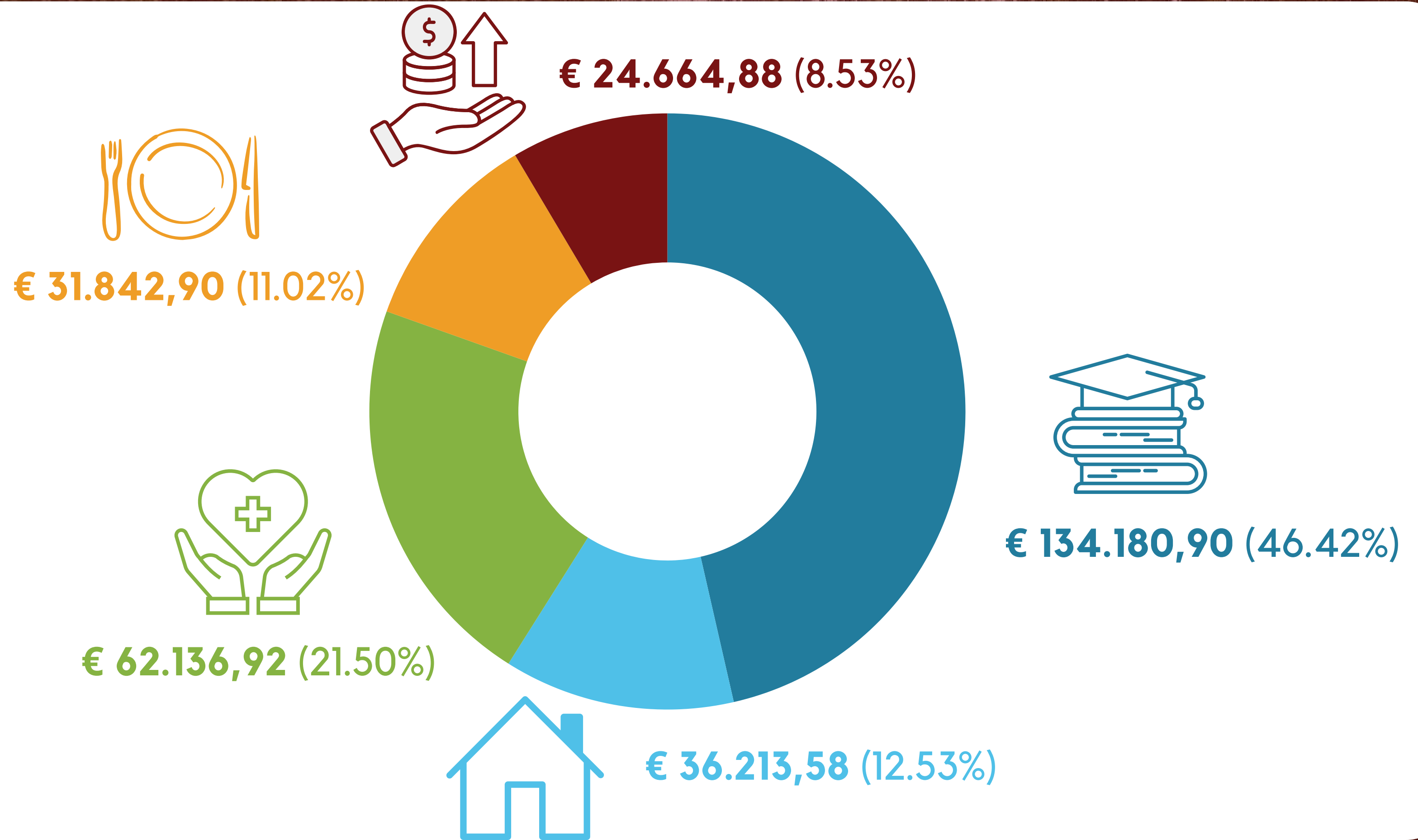

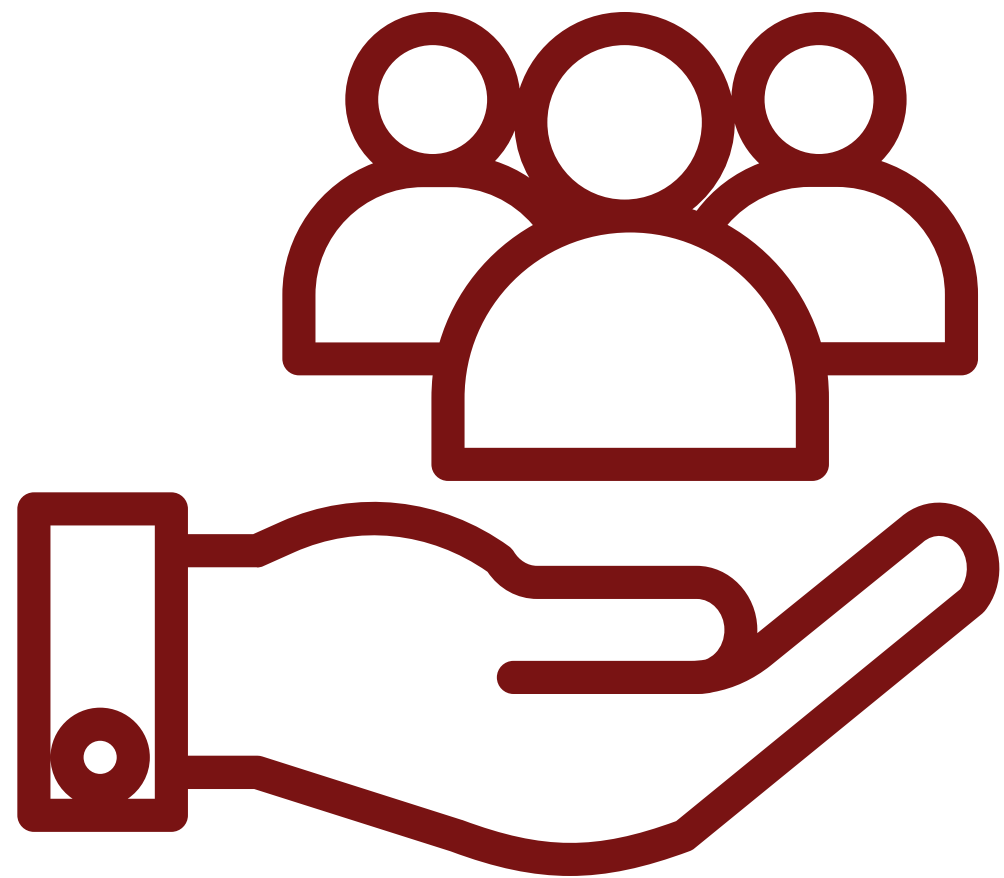


APPROVED AMOUNT BY CATEGORY



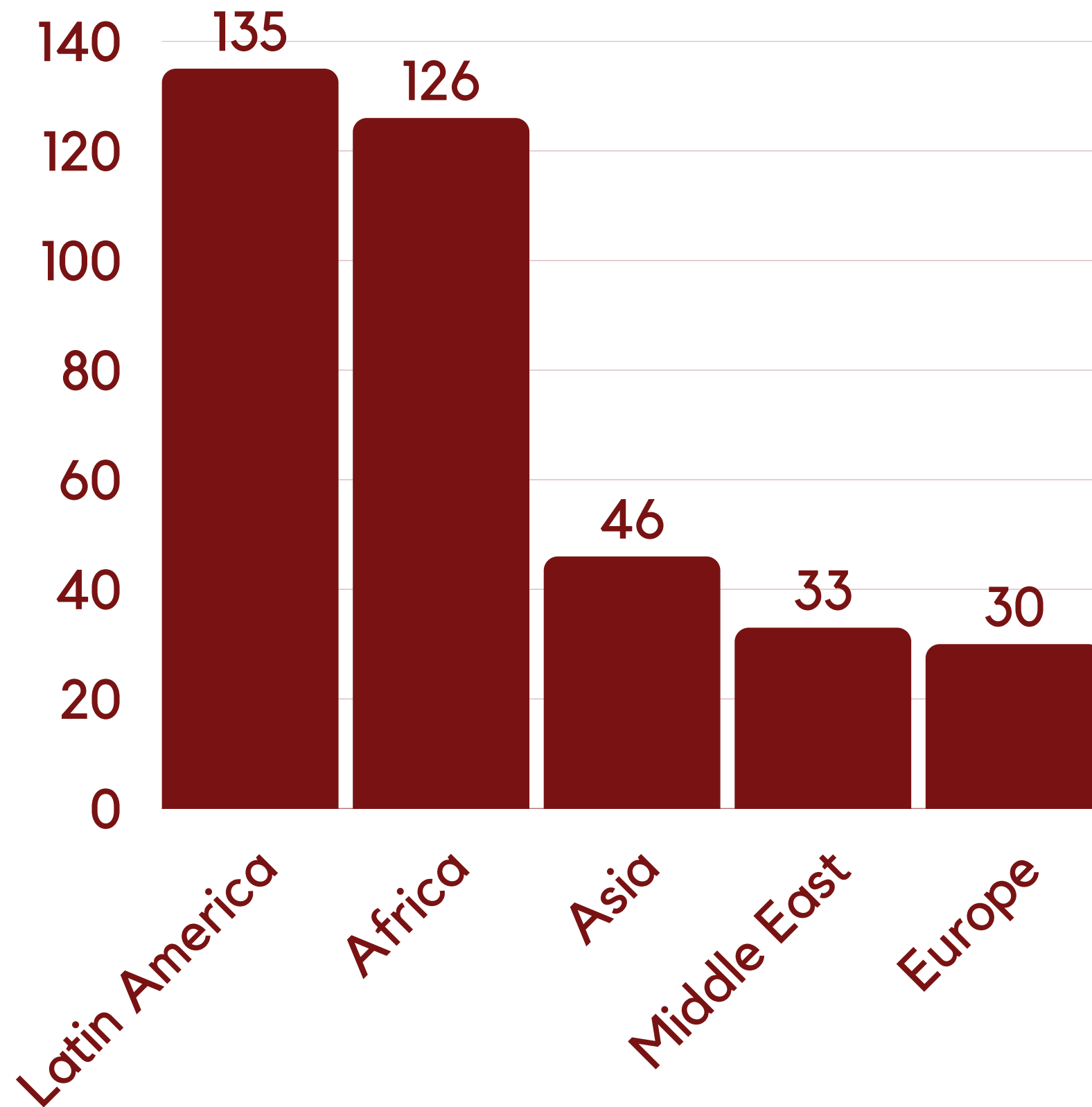


PARTICIPANTS REACHED BY GEOGRAPHICAL AREA

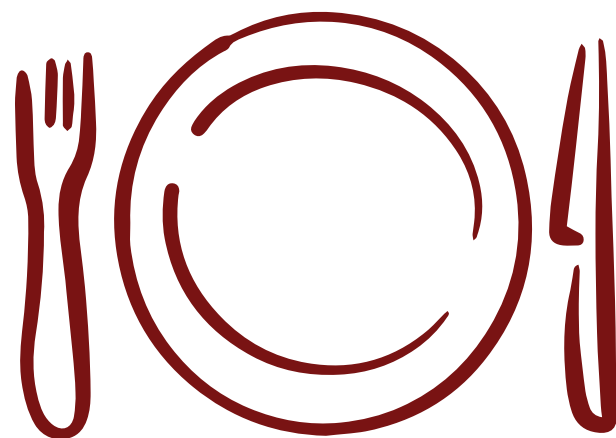

*"Unfortunately here a woman who has to give birth, if she wants to be sure that someone will help her, knows that she will have to take into account giving extra money to the midwife; and there are midwives without conscience who demand them too. **We young people need to change this mentality.** I talked about it with my colleagues and none of our group get extra money."*
